

## What is your ONE dream for Pine Valley?



### Dreams....continued

- A focus on a close-knit community was apparent, as **eight** respondents dreamed of a neighborly community where people supported each other and got along.
- A focus on access to eateries was present, as **one** respondent dreamed that 'two restaurants would be open full-time, supported by **one** respondent dreaming that downtown could be open '24/7', especially the eateries, and **two** respondents echoed this with a dream of an eatery that served breakfast every day of the week.
- **Two** respondents hoped for a gym, whereas another hoped for a lap pool for exercise, and another hoped for a track, highlighting respondents' hope for options for physical activity.



### Dreams....continued

- **Thirteen** respondents hoped for more affordable housing options, with a focus on residents, not vacation homes. Only one respondent dreamed that there would be no development in housing options
- **Thirty** respondents dreamed that Pine Valley would stay exactly the same as it is now, with no change being made to the community, whereas five respondents dreamed specifically of growth.
- **Six** respondents hoped for winter recreation opportunities and for Pine Valley to be a destination in the region for this winter recreation.
- **Ten** respondents dreamed of energy and economic self-sustainability and independence.



### Dreams....continued

- **Thirteen** respondents dreamed of a cleaned up and revitalized Pine Valley, whether that be Main Street, the downtown area, and/or the surrounding community area.
- **Two** respondents stated that they do not want Pine Valley to become 'another Bend (Oregon)' and three respondents stated that they didn't want residents of Western Oregon or California to move to Pine Valley and change the area to resemble California or Western Oregon. **Two** respondents worry that people coming to Pine Valley from other places may try to change it, and dream that it remains the same, untouched by outside values and ideas.
- **Two** respondents suggested a dark sky ordinance in Pine Valley.



### Dreams....continued

- There was a focus on community engagement and gathering spaces, with **five** respondents hoping for a community center, recreation center, arts and culture center or other community space to engage with others and ideas. **Two** respondents hoped for greater community involvement and attendance at local events. **Three** respondents dreamed of an increased focus on family-friendly community-based activities and events.
- **Sixteen** respondents hoped for more jobs and economic opportunities for a variety of people, especially the younger generation.
- **Fourteen** respondents dreamed of the continued success and prosperity of a safe and healthy Pine Valley that cares for its residents.



### Dreams....continued

- **Seven** respondents hoped for an increased focus on tourism and establishing Pine Valley as a destination. Though, **six** respondents worried about the negative effects of tourism on the residents of the area, as well as on the land itself.
- **Two** respondents dreamed of more opportunities and activities for local children, with **one** respondent focusing specifically on a better school.



***Preliminary conclusion: Dreams for the community vary considerably. Focus should be on areas of overlap, such as aesthetic updates to the community, increased economic opportunities and affordable housing.***
